

Our Learning



Literacy: We are continuing to learn the letters of the alphabet and their sounds. This month we will focus on the letters Ff, Bb, Gg, Cc, Ll, Ee, and Nn. Watch for the puppets in your child's zippered bag. Ask your child about the characters and their action. We are starting to use our letter sounds to identify the onset sounds in words and blending sounds we have learned to form words. Through stories, poems, and songs we will continue to generate rhyming words and develop new vocabulary. We are continuing to work on printing our name with one capital and the rest lower case letters. Please practice at home.

Fine Motor Skills: These are some the most important skills we work on. Please help them explore the use of scissors, draw shapes, print, and colour whenever possible!

Numeracy: We will continue our Patterns unit. We will recognize, create, and extend patterns through our Bears theme. Students will become aware of patterns in their environment. We will also continue to recognize and represent quantities in different ways.

Personal and Social Responsibility: We will be practicing independence by dressing ourselves in our winter wear. We will work on following the rules and routines of familiar environments. We will discuss how to respect family and friends, and how to express our personal feelings appropriately.

Library: Please continue the great job with returning library books on Tuesday's! Continue to read to your child daily. Ask your child questions and make comments during reading.

Cold Weather

- The kids go outside for physical activity regularly. It creates a space wherein elementary students can rest, imagine, think, play, move, and socialize. After movement, students tend to be more attentive and better able to perform cognitively.
- Please ensure that your child is ready for the cold weather. It's getting colder outside and I'm sure we'll be seeing snow soon. Yes, I said it....**SNOW**! Send your child to school dressed for the weather everyday with winter boots, snow pants, hats, and mittens. **Please make sure all items are labelled.** It helps us keep items out of the lost and found.
